

Objectives: The Early Republic

When I am finished learning about the Early Republic I will be able to identify and understand the following:

___ Students will learn how *George Washington* became the first president, and how he shaped the office of the presidency and served as an example for later presidents.

___ Students will examine the election of 1800. Students will analyze the importance of major events during the presidency of John Adams, such as the XYZ Affair and the Alien and Sedition Acts.

___ Students will examine the different ideas and principles of government held by Thomas Jefferson and Alexander Hamilton. Students will also learn how those differences led to the growth of political parties.

___ Students will examine the presidency of James Madison and the War of 1812. Students will analyze how the War of 1812 shaped future events in the nation.

___ Students will examine the Monroe Doctrine and how it changed the relationship between the United States and Latin America. Students will analyze how the Monroe Doctrine contributed to independence for some Latin American countries.

___ Students will examine the presidency of Andrew Jackson, the first "Common Man's" president. Students will learn about the treatment of Native Americans at this time, Focusing on the Trail of Tears. Students will analyze how growing differences between sections of the nation led to conflict and
